

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

It is always a good idea at this time of year to think about how your property is prepared to handle a severe storm. While we should certainly be most concerned about the health and well-being of ourselves and our loved ones, we often neglect to prepare a major part of our lives that cannot evacuate - our homes.

The two causes of property damage are from downed trees and flooding. During a storm the limbs from trees, and in some cases the trees themselves, can do significant damage to structures. With a little work before a storm, the risk of damage due to these factors can be reduced substantially.

Look into getting your trees a “check-up” for overall health, and getting them trimmed to prevent potential problems. A word of caution though about tree trimming: you might want to consider finding a Certified Arborist to do the trimming for you rather than attempting to do the work yourself by hauling a chainsaw up a 40-year-old extension ladder. An arborist will be able to efficiently trim to have the least impact on the trees, while effectively limiting the potential damage of branches falling in a storm. Additionally, an arborist will know the signs of a tree in distress and can make recommendations to avoid losing an entire tree.

An added benefit to trimming trees is that you will have less leaf litter to pick up come fall, which segues nicely into my next point: much of the flooding in our area can be attributed to debris in the gutters and storm drains. By making sure your street is free of leaves and loose branches, you allow the rainwater to drain as intended. These steps may help prevent an equally harsh effect on your property.

The Architectural Control Committee welcomes anyone who may be curious about what the committee does or who is potentially interested in joining the committee to call the office. The committee would like to say “welcome” to our recent new volunteers and to thank those who are longtime members on this committee.

Our goal first and foremost is to maintain the beauty and aesthetics of the subdivision.

Security Alert from Sgt. Gonzales

Over the Memorial Day weekend, we had several calls regarding burglaries of motor vehicle and thefts from vehicles. In all reports doors were left unlocked and unfortunately personal property was stolen. The theft from a vehicle was auto parts.

At this time, we have no evidence or leads to help further our investigations. I have also checked with Houston Police Department due to the number of reports they have taken and they also do not have any evidence or leads.

This year, Spring Shadows has been plagued with burglary of motor vehicle calls. I can safely say that between 90-95% of these vehicle burglaries involved unsecured vehicle doors as no forced entry was made by the suspect(s). All of these vehicle burglaries occur during the night time hours. These thieves are targeting computers, wallets, purses, cell phones, cash money and the most concerning items are firearms/handguns.

Pct. 5 Deputies are patrolling the subdivision and finding open garage doors and vehicle dome lights on. The Deputies are getting out and trying to notify owners to secure their property. Please help curtail crime in our area by locking your vehicle doors and garages. Remove your personal property from the interior of your vehicles.

If any resident has cameras outside their homes for security purposes, please check them out daily to look for suspicious persons and or vehicles. Please let us know as soon as possible if you have captured anything that might help in any investigation. Please check the outside of your homes to see if it is well lit and your alarms are working properly.

Remember...If you see something, Say something!!



When you hear gunshots fired in your neighborhood be sure to call the Pct. 5 Dispatch phone number above and report it. Realize that law enforcement does not enter the reported area with lights and sirens blaring alerting the bad guys to leave the area quickly. Instead law enforcement will enter the reported scene area in a quiet manner in hopes of catching the bad guys in their illegal act.

MOSQUITO SPRAYING

A spray truck comes through once per week beginning about April and ending in about October. That varies depending on need. MLS Report for May 2017 **HOUSTON HOME SALES AND RENTALS HEAT UP IN MAY**

Market continues to outpace last year's record performance

HOUSTON — (June 13, 2017) — Sales and rentals of homes throughout greater Houston continue to outpace 2016's record performance, as May marked another month of strong consumer activity and growing inventory. The greatest sales gains took place among homes priced from \$750,000 and above (categorized as the luxury market), followed by homes in the \$150,000 to \$249,999 range. May marked the seventh consecutive month of rising sales in the luxury segment.

The single-family home median price (the figure at which half of the homes sold for more and half sold for less) climbed 4.4 percent to \$235,000. That marks the highest median price of all time.

The average price rose 4.3 percent to \$302,362, the second highest average ever. Days on Market (DOM), or the number of days it took the average home to sell, declined slightly to 51 days versus 53 days last year.

Inventory rose from a 3.6 months supply to 4.1 months, matching a level not seen since November 2012.

Broken out by housing segment, May sales performed as follows:

\$1 - \$99,999:	unchanged
\$100,000 - \$149,999:	decreased 5.3 percent
\$150,000 - \$249,999:	increased 13.7 percent
\$250,000 - \$499,999:	increased 12.9 percent
\$500,000 - \$749,999:	increased 8.5 percent
\$750,000 and above:	increased 27.6 percent

Harris County ReadyHarris App Receives Award of Excellence

The Harris County Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Management (HCOHSEM) received an Award of Excellence for its ReadyHarris app from the Texas Association of Municipal Information Officers (TAMIO) at its annual conference this June.

"We are honored to be recognized by communication professionals from around the state for our mobile app," said Harris County Judge Ed Emmett. "The ReadyHarris app helps our residents better prepare and stay informed during emergencies."

The ReadyHarris app delivers real-time weather alerts, hosts a step-by-step guide to building a personalized family disaster plan, offers survival tip sheets, maps evacuation routes, and locates local emergency services.

"Every minute counts when severe weather, or any emergency, threatens our community," said Emmett. "The ReadyHarris app empowers residents to make a personal plan and receive life-saving information at their fingertips."

Since its release, the ReadyHarris app has been successfully promoted mainly through social media. In just a few months, the app has been downloaded more than 12,300 times. This free app is available at the [Apple App Store and Google Play](#) in both English and Spanish.

The TAMIO awards recognize outstanding communication products in various categories including, website, social media, video production and publications. BREATHING SMOKE from BURNED POISON IVY

Removing poison ivy requires proper knowledge of how to handle the plant safely. Some people think the fastest and easiest way to remove poison ivy is by burning it in their backyard fire pit or chimenea.

A homeowner in Spring Shadows did exactly this, not knowing what they were doing, and as a result one of their neighbors ended up in the emergency room with breathing problems, swelling of the eyes and face, blisters all over the body, and a fever.

If burned, poison ivy oils can be carried through the air and infect the airways of people in the surrounding areas for miles; the same goes for poison oak and poison sumac. These plants should be collected with protective clothing and put in a City of Houston yard waste bag for weekly Friday yard waste collection or put out, also bagged, for heavy trash/yard waste on the 4th Friday of odd numbered months.

Know what these plants look like and never burn them in your outdoor fire pit, barbecue, or chimenea



Section 16.3.4 of the Houston Fire Department Life Safety Bureau (LSB) Standard 16 states,

“Barbecue pits shall not be used for the burning of trash, rubbish, or discarded leaves and branches”.

We hope all members understand that this type of practice is not allowed in the City of Houston or in the Spring Shadows subdivision. Abiding by these regulations will keep any future residents safe from being poisoned by these air borne toxins.

PURPOSE OF THE CIVIC ASSOCIATION

The Spring Shadows Civic Association is organized and incorporated to exercise, promote, and protect the covenants and interests of residents of the Spring Shadows Subdivision, Houston, Texas; to foster a healthy interest in the civic affairs of the community; to develop and encourage good citizenship by establishing a feeling of mutual pride and unity among the residents of the subdivision; to inquire into civic abuses and to seek relief or reformation thereof, especially with respect to those abuses affecting either the residents of the subdivision or the subdivision itself, and to enhance and maintain both the value and aesthetic qualities of properties located within the subdivision.

IT'S THE LAW

Houston, Texas – Code of ordinances /Chapter 28
MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES AND PROVISIONS

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Sec. 28-1. - Obstructing ditches.

It shall be unlawful for any person to throw or deposit in any ditch anything which will in any way obstruct the free flow of water through the same.

(Code 1968, § 28-3)

SPRING SHADOWS INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATES

The Spring Shadows North CIP (Capital Improvement Project) is in the design stage and scheduled to begin construction during COH (City of Houston) fiscal year 2018. There will be no sidewalks required in this project per the request of the majority of the homeowners in this section. This affects the 2500 - 2600 blocks, North and South of Westray, specifically Talina Way, Southwick, Hollow Hook Drive, Teague Road, Anniston Drive, Bandelier Drive, Moss Hill Drive, Pomeran Drive, Rosefield Drive, Pine Village Drive, Parana Drive, and Palo Pinto Drive. There will be new drainage pipes, and new pavement but NO sidewalks.

The Spring Shadows South CIP Project has been placed in the CIP cycle for fiscal year 2019 with design and construction scheduled to begin in fiscal year 2020. Precinct 4 Commissioner Jack Cagle has agreed to work with the City of Houston and help provide funding for this project which also includes Campbell Woods and Neuens Road from Blalock to Gessner. Hopefully, an Interlocal Agreement between the city and county will provide enough funding to advance this project a year ahead of current planning. Both of these projects include major drainage and roadway improvements. That should alleviate continued flooding in the Spring Shadows and Campbell Woods Subdivisions.

Harris County Flood Control District has a contractor ready to proceed with improvements to Buttermilk Creek from Beltway 8 to its intersection with Spring Branch Creek as soon as a quality control assessment has been completed on the design. Current plans are for this project to begin construction within the next few months.

Harris County Flood Control District is also working on the ditch between Kempwood and Kemp Forest. We are working to determine the extent of the work being performed as it is apparent that there are repairs needed to some of the outfalls in the ditch.

Meritage Homes LLC has begun construction on Spring Brook Village, a series of gated communities being built at the former Pinecrest Golf Course. The project includes major drainage improvements for the area which will also be part of the amenities for the subdivision. Currently construction is underway for Pinecrest Section 2, located at the northeast corner of Kemp Forest Drive and Teague Road. This section contains 121 lots and 21 restricted reserves for open space, landscape, and parking purposes only.

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
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
